The **Aylmer Police** and the **CN Railroad Police** would like to advise local residents that by the end of November 2015, the railway line between Tillsonburg, Aylmer, and St. Thomas Ontario will be back in service and will eventually see approximately 2 trains a day. Various commodities such as fertilizer and Ethanol will be shipped on the line. There is also potential to expand service to other local businesses. This line will be used by the **Ontario Southland Railway (OSR)**.

Pedestrians are reminded to only cross the train tracks at designated crossings and obey the crossing protection devices and to look both ways before crossing. Walking on or along railway tracks is not only dangerous but also trespassing, and can result in fines from \$65 to \$125.

Motorists are also reminded to obey the crossing gates and lights, and to wait until the train is clear of the crossing before proceeding, nobody wins when you try to “beat the train”. Fines for drivers disobeying the crossing protection can range from \$110 to \$185.
